#### Rev'd Sophie writes: New Beginnings

Have you begun thinking about your New Year's resolution for 2026? Will you wait for the clock to strike midnight on the 31st of December, ready to begin a new habit, a new routine, perhaps a new diet after the feast of Christmas? Did you make a resolution this year — and how long did it last?

Many people use the beginning of the calendar year to set goals for self-improvement, often around health, finances, relationships, or personal growth. Yet studies suggest that by February, 80% of these resolutions have already been broken, with the second Friday in January even dubbed "Quitters' Day". Too often, resolutions are vague or unrealistic, made with the best-case scenario in mind rather than acknowledging the days when we are tired, overwhelmed, or struggling. We imagine ourselves at our most energetic and determined, but rarely plan for the moments when life feels heavy.

And yet, year after year, people return to this tradition. The practice of making resolutions may even stretch back thousands of years. The Babylonians are thought to have made promises to their gods at the start of each year, pledging to return borrowed items or pay their debts. The Romans honoured Janus, the god of beginnings and transitions, whose two faces looked both backward and forward. In many ways, our modern resolutions echo these ancient practices: we look back at what we wish had been different, and forward to what we hope might change. The turning of the calendar gives us the sense of a "fresh start," motivating us to see the 1st of January as a new beginning.

Psychologists call this the "fresh start effect." A new date, a new season, even a birthday can give us the feeling of a clean slate. It inspires us to set goals and imagine change. But the difficulty lies in sustaining that change. Resolutions often rely on sheer willpower, and when willpower falters, we feel we have failed. What is missing is grace — the ability to begin again, even after stumbling. Without grace, resolutions can feel like a burden rather than a gift.

The Church calendar invites us to mark time differently. Advent, beginning on the fourth Sunday before Christmas, marks the start of the Church's year. This year, on the 30th of November, we enter a new lectionary cycle, with Matthew's Gospel guiding our Sunday readings. Deeply rooted in its Hebrew origins, Matthew's Gospel carries a central theme: promise and fulfilment.

Matthew begins with a genealogy, tracing Jesus' lineage back through Israel's history. It is a reminder that the story of Christ is not a sudden break, but the fulfilment of God's promises across generations. Time in Matthew's Gospel is not simply about new beginnings, but about God's faithfulness. The Sermon on the Mount, the parables, and

the passion narrative all point to a God who keeps promises and brings them to completion in Christ. The promise of the coming of God's kingdom, where justice, love, and grace will reign for all creation.

For us, this means that every new beginning is not isolated, but part of God's unfolding story. A story that we are invited to join in once again. Not with fireworks, but with a single candle lit on a wreath as we remember those who came before us.

Advent opens the new year not with hurried resolutions, but by inviting us into a period of reflection and preparation. It is a season of waiting and watching, of hope and promise. Not a passive waiting, as an audience waiting to see a show, but an active waiting, a preparation, as we wait for the curtains to open. Advent is like preparing a home for a guest: tidying, setting the table, lighting candles. We prepare not out of duty, but out of love and anticipation.

Active waiting means shaping our lives in anticipation. Just as a theatre audience leans forward as the curtain begins to rise, Advent invites us to lean forward into God's promise.

The midnight countdown on the 31st of December may inspire us to change, but the quiet candles of Advent invite us to be transformed. We are invited to slow down, to reflect, and to prepare our hearts. We prepare by prayer, by acts of kindness, by listening more attentively to Scripture. We prepare by noticing where God is already at work, and by opening ourselves to be part of God kingdom at work in the world.

This preparation is not only for December. It sets the rhythm for the whole year ahead. Advent teaches us to begin with reflection, to root our resolutions not in fleeting determination but in God's enduring promise. Advent is our rehearsal for living the rest of the year with hope, courage, and joy.

So as we step into this new year, may your resolutions not depend on perfection, but on grace. May Advent be your true new beginning — a season that sets the rhythm for the year ahead, rooted in God's promise and fulfilled in Christ.





# Holy Trinity, Cookham Choirs

Youth Choir – open to any keen young singer, aged 8 and above. Choristers attend a weekly practice (Tuesdays, 6.30-7.05pm) and one, sometimes two, Sunday services a month. No special equipment or financial outlay needed. Choristers receive 'pay', based on attendance, at the end of each term.

Choristers' Mums' Choir – originally set up as an opportunity for choristers' mums to sing too, recently we have welcomed ex-choristers who have moved back to the area. With this widening of eligibility, we would be pleased to hear from ladies who might wish to sing with this friendly group. Practices: Wednesday, 6.55-7.30pm; one, sometimes two, Sunday services a month.

**Alter Chorum** – a choir for ladies aged 60+. Open to willing new recruits who would like to enjoy good company and joyful singing. Practices every other Tuesday, 5.50-6.25pm; one Sunday service every six weeks.

**Men's Choir** – Practices: Wednesday evening or Saturday morning; usually three Sunday services a month. Alto, tenor and bass voice-parts. Due to the difficulty of the music and the speed at which the choir works, very proficient sight-reading ability is necessary to thrive in this hard-working group.

Our numbers may be small but we still make a good sound to support our congregational singing and worship.



#### Birds of the Bible

Well obviously, the avian choice for this month has to be the Turkey; but hard as one might try, you won't find reference to such a creature in the bible! Of the 30 or so species we can choose from, one does however come to mind. With Christmas we celebrate the One who humbled himself for us, so what could be more appropriate than the humble Sparrow!

In Hebrew, Sparrows would normally be included within the term 'Tziporah' which occurs over forty times, but in fact this refers to almost any small bird. 'Sparrow' however appears on just six occasions, including Matthew 8:29 where Jesus Himself indicates that, despite the bird's 'lowly' status, God cares for each one of them. But even here we see the birds were being sold, for just a halfpenny piece; why? For food. They were part of the staple diet for the poor. And Jesus' teaching is that, if God cares for even each of these, how much more does He care for us. (Still today, millions of small migrating birds such as Sparrows are trapped in lime on Mediterranean coastal hedges for serving at local cafes!)

Most bible translations of Psalm 84:3 opt for 'Sparrow', indicating the provision made for them to nest and raise their young and relating that to God's even greater care for us.

But what sort of Sparrow are we talking about in Israel? Spanish Sparrow is resident but mainly a bird of open countryside rather than domestic environments. And guess where the Dead Sea Sparrow might be found? Then there are Rock Sparrows occupying the mountain tops and migrant species include Pale Rock Sparrow. But prominent among all these is the humble House Sparrow (Passer domesticus), an abundant resident of domestic settings across the bible lands, as it is indeed here in our own 'Green and Pleasant land'.



Therefore, I would like to think this is the one referred to in the scriptures. But how is it doing here? Regrettably, UK numbers have declined some 60% in recent decades. A recent study in London found five whole boroughs with no records at all! This was reflected in the all-Berkshire survey for our latest County Bird Atlas, with dramatic declines in both rural and town environments, where 'neat' gardens and modern house design includes little facility for this bird of simple needs. (I did though once count c125 on feeders here at Broomhill Mansions!)

So, what could our Christmas present be to this diminutive but, in God's eyes, important species? Why not use January to plan a 'Wild About Gardens' make-over, a scheme WildCookham has been promoting for all its decade of existence. Give the mower a rest to allow some grass to do what it is designed to do.

#### So much to celebrate

Tackling the (already for many) catastrophic impacts of climate change and the loss of so much of our natural world can feel like a lost cause sometimes. So it's important to remember all the positive steps people are taking to ensure we have a world that's safe for future generations.

Looking back over the past year, WildCookham has much to celebrate. The Water Voles we re-introduced several years ago to the home of The Wind in the Willows are doing well; the work of recent years to bring back a wider range of wild flowers and insects to our local Commons is paying dividends with more colour sand species on several of the Commons; new hedgerows have been put in to help restore some of the 300,000 miles of these crucial habitats destroyed in recent decades; plans are in place for new ponds, a key habitat for wildlife; our input to local government keeps up the pressure to address the environment and climate emergency; and a growing number of residents want to encourage wildlife on their land and are seeking our support. Add to that those using our walks and talks to increase awareness, as well as the many residents who are helping us with all this work, and you get a sense that maybe, just maybe, we really can make a difference.

One individual whose contribution we have celebrated is Lynne Peperell. Lynne was a founder member of Cookham Wildlife Supporters, our original name. Her energy and commitment have supported us in so many ways, but notably in organising many of our events and, most especially, in helping to run our Wildlife Gardens Awards. We said a fond farewell to Lynne at a party for volunteers in November and wish her and Richard well in their new life away from Cookham.

As we enter 2026 we are busy with longer term planning to help us focus on the main challenges. We see these as working with landowners to save as much of our local land as possible for nature and involving the whole community in this work. Watch out for more news of this. Meanwhile, here's one thing you can do: join in with the RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch in January: it's a great way to see what's in your garden – and to get children involved. #### **Cookham Community Allotment**

We are constantly being advised in the daily press to follow certain steps and the result will be a fitter/longer-living/better-balanced/less-tired/happier individual etc etc. After one such article on 'the guide to super-ageing' in the *i* paper recently, one reader's response was quite emphatic. As a septuagenarian married over 50 years, who never needs to visit their doctor, he gave this simple piece of advice. "Rent an allotment within walking distance from home and garden organically. With a rental of less than £1 per week, the produce alone more than covers this." Indeed, fresh air, eating more vegetables, getting regular exercise, and being flexible in thinking are all benefits of growing your own and enjoying your own outdoor space with the option for social interaction should you need it.

Rent an allotment? At this time of year? It may not have as much appeal as during some balmy days in spring. However, now is in fact a very good time to take on an allotment. There are vacancies on all three sites in Cookham! Very little grows at this time of year, so nor do the weeds. By putting down weed suppressant membrane or cardboard, the beds can be left during the next couple of months. No double digging is necessary, especially if you follow the current thinking for 'no dig'. Order or have delivered organic matter such as manure, much of which may be available for free in this area. Let the earthworms do the work and your soil structure will benefit. Now is the perfect time to build yourself at least a couple of compost bays using wooden pallets, also available for free. Here you can put in a bottom layer of rough grass and sticks before grass cuttings and annual weeds are readily available to add. Leaves can be raked up now and stored in a chicken-wire cage easily erected in a corner. These will rot down and give you a good, free soil-improver for the following years. Shorter days give you time to plan what you hope to grow where, to make a list, and order seeds. By the time the days are getting longer and hopefully warming up you will be ready to start sowing and growing. For less than £1 per week (how much is that gym membership?) you can tick all the boxes to ensure a longer, healthier happier life, and who knows.... you might enjoy it too!

If you would like to join us before taking the plunge and taking on your own allotment, I guarantee you will learn something, have your questions answered, share in tasty produce and refreshments at end of gardening sessions.



#### **COOKHAM VOLUNTARY SERVICES**

A chance to take part in a key local community service!

CVS is a local self-funding community organisation, which provides an essential role taking people who need help with transport to get to medical appointments. We depend entirely on volunteers to meet the needs of members of the community.

#### **Dial 01628**

The big digital phone revolution is starting. Everyone will shortly need to transfer their existing BT landline connections to the new digital network. And some lines are already about to switch.

Amongst the first local organisations to go digital will be Cookham Voluntary Services and Elizabeth House.

In both cases the phone numbers will not change, but you will have to **dial the full number, including the 01628** area code, even if you are dialing from another 01628 number.

So, make sure you make a note of this and if you are not already doing so start using the full 01628 number now. Rest assured, it will work even before the switchover.

For CVS the number to dial is 01628 523839.

For Elizabeth House dial is 01628 527621.



#### **Cookham Parish Council**

As a result of Neighbourhood Plan, the Parish now will receive 25% of the Community Infrastructure Levy ("CIL") payable by developers on new housing developments in

the Parish. Paragraph 9.4 of the Plan explained that: "Ideas for the spending of CIL receipts on projects in the Parish include, but are not limited to, those identified in Appendix 8 of the Neighbourhood Plan." The Parish Council can add to these Projects.

The 12 Projects in the original Appendix 8 range from improvements to green spaces and air quality to new walking and cycling routes. The Parish Council is now consulting on the addition of a new Project. This is to enlarge and enhance the Parish Cemetery and Chapel on Long Lane.

The Parish has outgrown the original cemetery, founded in 1906. The 1995 extension is already in use. With new housing planned for the Parish demand is likely to grow. The fullness of Holy Trinity and near-fullness of St John's Church cemeteries means that the Parish Cemetery is the primary remaining burial ground in the Parish. The Parish Council therefore feels that the cemetery needs to be enlarged. (A cemetery is acceptable green belt use since the land remains green and open.)

The Chapel is also over 100 years old: sadly, it shows it. It is draughty with little heating and generally needs an overhaul. There is no lavatory. There is no car park: mourners have to park in Long Lane, awkward for residents and potentially dangerous. It needs upgrading.

The full proposal can be found on the Parish Council website at <a href="www.cookham-pc.gov.uk">www.cookham-pc.gov.uk</a>. Comments can be emailed to <a href="mailto:office@cookham-pc.gov.uk">office@cookham-pc.gov.uk</a> or posted to the Council Office in High Road. There will be an open house from 10am – 3pm and a public meeting at 7pm on Wednesday 17 December, both in the Community Room there. Consultation is open until 5pm on Monday 20 December.

We are working to beautify the Parish. 400 bulbs are being planted by Councillors and volunteers in the Alfred Major Recreation Ground (where the order for a large new bin by the skate-ramp has now been placed) and elsewhere. We hope our daffodils will brighten spring.

Boringly but we hope wisely, we have adopted a new IT policy, updated our risk management policy, put in place a new half-yearly internal audit and attended to some trees over-hanging our neighbours in Groves Way. We are continuing our internal updating programme.

We have started the budget process for the 2026/7 financial year. RBWM's own budget cycle means that we have to decide our precept by mid-January. There will therefore be a budget update at Council on 2 December with the final decisions on 6 January.

It is good to report that the Environment Agency has completed erecting a reasonably good-looking and sensibly sized fence on the south-west wing wall of the weir as we agreed. Now we await, and will if necessary push for, the re-opening of the bridge across the weir to the footpath and the Lock.

Finally, we have created a new Planning Working Party. The Borough is about to start the process of updating the Borough Local Plan. We need to be organised and ready to fight for Cookham. We are likely also to want to update

#### **Cookham Saint-Benoit Twinning**

Twenty-two people from Cookham Twinning went to Saint-Benoit at the end of October for a long weekend with our twinned village. We stayed with local families and improved our knowledge of local French life, as well as our language skills, whatever our starting level.

The visit started with a reception at the Mairie (Town Hall) hosted by the Mayor of Saint-Benoit, Bernard Peterlongo. Cookham gave Saint-Benoit a copy of the Cookham Neighbourhood plan, an illustrated guide to the Thames Valley, and a photo-book of last year's visit of Saint-Benoit to Cookham. After some short speeches, Liliane Louvel, a Professor at Poitiers University spoke about the book that she is publishing about Stanley Spencer, so another link with Cookham. On Monday the group went to Tours with a walking tour and a visit to the 'Musée du Compagnonnage', (Master Craftsman Museum). This is a unique French institution showing the work of specialist artisans who must pass rigorous tests to be accepted into the guild. Displays were of woodworking, leather, stone, leather and textiles.

As always, we were very well looked after, with good opportunities to sample French cuisine. Saint-Benoit will be visiting Cookham next October, and it's a great opportunity to hear about French culture, and perhaps improve your French GCSE skills!

#### And those Christmas cards...


We send an estimated 950 million Christmas cards in the UK each year. Royal Mail delivers around 150 million. On average, each person in the UK sends and receives about 17 cards.


